A Message from the Boardroom

elcome all to the 2024-2025 fiscal year here at the University Club. Our new fiscal year brings the Club new Board members, and this year as your new President, I am honored to follow Mark Cooper's example of thoughtful leadership. I look forward to his experience and steady guidance on the new Board as President Emeritus. Our former Emeritus, Gilda Gomez, will be taking a break from Board duties, but I am lucky that several other members of the past Board will remain with me as we transition.

Glen Winter, whose financial skills are greatly appreciated, is leaving the position of Treasurer for the VP Finance Chair. Paul Breines, another member with terrific financial skills, will take over as Treasurer, while Ann Sapp, our Assistant Treasurer, will remain to assist Paul in that important position. Sandy Rizzo, who has had great success at fundraising, is remaining as VP Development, as is Ed Korry who will continue to get the most out of our Intellectual Activities. Richard Oehmler, whose work has increased our membership from 365 to 492 in his first year, will remain as our VP Membership. We will also retain two of our At-Large Board Members: Michael Kakos and Paul Mandelkern will return to give us their expertise on Board issues.

Other members are leaving their current positions but will remain on the Board. Roger MacDonald will leave the position of VP House and Grounds—after numerous beautification projects, a practically new kitchen and money-saving lighting—but will remain as our non-voting Ombudsman, while Lou Korahais will reprise his role as Parliamentarian to provide continuity and keep us operating within our rules. In addition, a few previous Board members will provide Board experience but in new positions.

I am pleased to have Maria Delose, our previous secretary, as my new Vice President. Her keen observations and thoughtful advice were welcome on the Board, and I look forward to her help in the next year. Diana Secor, a past president and VP House and Grounds, with Sherry Levy as her Associate, will take over the role of VP Programs from Georgiana Havill, whose creativity brought us great new Programs. Steve Bertha, a previous Board member who has done a fantastic job as our Public Relations Chair, is also rejoining the Board as an At-Large Director, to replace Ruth Edwards, whose term has ended.

And while we need experienced members on the Board, we also want to encourage newer members to consider serving. We greatly appreciate those who have volunteered this year, including William McGuiness, a relatively new member with a background in construction, who will take up the VP House and Grounds position, while Judy Burke will replace Maria Delose as our Secretary. Both have already provided sound ideas for their new jobs.

I believe it is important for members to know who sits on your Club Board because your Board carries heavy responsibilities. Board members have an obligation to exercise sound judgement and to discount their own personal interests, viewpoints, or sentiments in favor of what is best for our Club and its members. While many decisions are relatively easy, difficult problems do occur and deliberation can be contentious, but we hope the membership will recognize that Board members take their duty to the Club quite seriously, that they do their due diligence, and any decisions made have been thoroughly considered to reach a consensus that supports the best interests of our Club. We will continue our efforts to serve those interests.




