Peter King CBS Radio News



Peter King has reported for *CBS News Radio* since 1994, covering regional and national stories. He's covered scores of hurricanes, tornados, Super Bowls, World Series, and contributed stories from baseball's spring training in Florida. In short, King has covered nearly every major news story coming out of the Southeast for decades.

King has covered more than sixty missions of the NASA Space Shuttle program. He broadcast the first network radio report of trouble as the Columbia accident unfolded in 2003, in addition to other space milestones such as construction of the International Space

Station and John Glenn's return to space in 1998. King also covers Space X's commercial human spaceflights.

His reporting has won many awards, including several shared Edward R. Murrow and Headliner Awards at CBS News, and "Best Investigative Reporting" and "Best Serious Feature" from the Associated Press of Florida. His documentary, *One Giant Leap: Revisited*, commemorating the fiftieth anniversary of Apollo 11, won Best Documentary in the history category at the New York Festivals Radio Awards. In 2023, the National Space Club and Foundation presented him with its Press Award, only the fourth CBS News journalist to be so honored (the others



were Edward R. Murrow, Walter Cronkite, and William Harwood). He has been honored by the Central Florida Press Club and Florida AP Broadcasters, and was recipient in 2017 of the latter's Legacy Award for distinguished service with its annual college workshop. King also lectures and teaches writing at colleges in the northeast.
