The Finance Committee of the Club is charged with the The University Club management of the Club's endowment investments. For more than twenty years, the endowment has supplemented the Club's expenses every year which has allowed the Club to keep the dues at a reasonable level. In fact, this calendar year through November 30, the endow-

ment fund has contributed \$200,000 to supplement the club's operating and capital expenditures. In addition and due to the knowledgeable guidance of the Finance Committee over the years, the investment fund has grown to several million dollars.

The current Finance Committee members are Glen Winter, Chair, Paul Breines, Ann Sapp, Noel Delaney, Denny Dionne, Jim Fitch, Lou Korahais, Nancy Ponting, and Rosemary Vendena, with Jeannie Schiff and Maria Delose as ex-officio members. This group has an incredible amount of experience and expertise dealing with finance and investments. We are lucky to have them on the committee.

The Club's income sources are limited to dues, rental fees, and contributions. The total of those cover about one-third of the Club's operating expenses, so this is where the endowment investment supplements Club expenses. Also, our capital expenses such as those used for the new gazebo and refinishing the floor in the ballroom come out of the endowment investment fund. Through the years, many of our members have contributed to the endowment fund through bequests in their Will. If this is something that you would consider, the Club would be extremely grateful. There are many ways to do this and we have several club members with expertise in this area. The Finance Committee wishes you a happy and prosperous New Year and many hours of fun and enjoyment ay the University Club of Winter Park!


