It's Better to Give and Receive

It seems like we just celebrated Memorial Day, and yet here we are about to celebrate Labor Day - for northerners, it's the end of the summer. For Central Florida residents, not so much.

From speaking with many Club members, there is a mistaken belief that our Club dues (which haven't been raised for more than seven years) are sufficient to cover all of our Club's operating expenses. Not true! At best, dues cover approximately 30% of our expenses. The balance comes from annual donations, bequests, rentals, and our endowment fund. Any shortfall is met by moving funds from the UCWP endowment fund to our operating checking account.

We have been blessed by having an astute Finance Committee that has provided double-digit average returns for over a decade. No matter how good our Finance Committee is, the law of averages has not been repealed and we would be hard-pressed to duplicate those results, so we need to increase voluntary donations to our Club.

Fortunately, for those members who would like to help UCWP (or any other 501c3 charitable organization), there is a taxwise way to do this, thanks to a legal loophole in the law requiring Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from your qualified retirement accounts (traditional IRAs, 401ks, etc). Typically, when you make a charitable donation, a check is written and the contribution is considered a tax-deductible expense and does not reduce your adjusted gross income (AGI). Many retirees are unaware that they can donate all or a portion of their RMD directly to charity. It's called a qualified charitable distribution or OCD.

QCDs do not provide a charitable deduction for taxpayers, regardless of whether or not you itemize deductions. Instead, with a QCD, a check is sent directly from your financial institution holding your retirement funds. This allows the donor to **exclude** the amount from taxable income. To illustrate the benefits, here are four ways RMDs can increase taxes:

- 1-RMDs can push retirees into a higher tax bracket, as RMDs are ordinary income.
- 2-Medicare Surtax: RMDs also increase the taxpayer's Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI), which can trigger the 3.8% Medicare surtax.
- 3-Taxing Social Security: Even modest RMDs can cause Social Security benefits to become taxable, up to 85% for single filers with income above \$34,000 or married couples with income above \$44,000 Your benefits may be taxable if the total of (1) one-half of your benefits, plus (2) all of your other income, including tax-exempt interest, is greater than the base amount for your filing status.

4-Medicare Part B & D Premiums: are calculated on your MAGI from two years ago. So large RMDs can cause sharp increases to your Medicare costs.

The tax and psychic benefits of using a QCD are worth considering. Of course, please consult with your tax advisor to see the appropriateness of a QCD in your situation.


