The Finance Committee of the University Club of Winter Park is responsible for managing the investments of the club. The original funds for these investments are the result of several large endowments to the Club made many years ago. Over the past several decades the members of the many finance committees have wisely and prudently invested these funds, resulting in a substantial increase in the Club's investment balance. In the 2025 calendar year, the investment balance increased by 10.1%. This is after \$170,000 was advanced from the investments to support the operations of the Club. Over the last ten years, over \$1,750,000 has been advanced to support Club operations and capital improvements (new roof). Our dues and rental income only support about two-thirds of the Club's operating budget. The reminder is advanced from the original endowments, which are managed by the many knowledgeable people who have served on the committee.

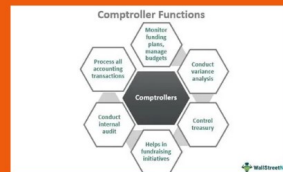
